Summary of the Boxing Competition Rules (for the complete IBA regulations see iba.sport)

Boxers born in 2012 or younger can only box exhibition bouts 3 rounds of 1 minute with a draw (2 winners) as result.

If both parties, the supervisor and CuraBox agree, a boxer can compete in a single bout against a boxer from a higher class, but only 1 class higher and according to the rules of the youngest age class of both, like both wearing headgear.

Pre-bout medical examination and the Weigh-In must be on the same day as the Bout. If one exceeds the maximum weight limit, he/she is not allowed to compete and the opponent will win by Walkover (WO).

Eligibility on Medical-related Issues

- Only soft contact lenses allowed. All other contact lenses are prohibited. If the boxer loses contact lenses, the boxer accepts to continue to box and the bout continues or the boxer does not accept to continue to box without contact lenses, the referee terminates the bout, and the opponent is declared the winner by ABD (abandon).
- A boxer wearing braces on both upper and lower sets of teeth, can box if he/she is wearing a fitted gumshield.
- Allowed to use Kinesiology taping; but it can only be applied from waist down, and to the back of the body.
- No body piercing and no body accessories are permitted to be worn during a bout.
- All prohibited conditions for competition, like; epilepsy, dressing on a cut, wound abrasion, laceration or blood swelling (scalp, face incl. nose, ears), etc. are outlined in the IBA Medical Rules.

Boxer's uniform and equipment

- IBA approved boxing gloves in the color of the corner. 12 oz for Men youth & elite +67 kg. All other 10 oz.
- Elite NO headgear. All other MUST wear headgear. May use own headgear if approved (hygiene). If a boxer is not wearing a headguard and has hair that reaches below the neckline, a hair net or any other item must be worn to control the hair. The hair must be secured appropriately.
- Footwear, such as shoes or light boots (without spikes or heels) and socks not higher than the knee.
- Mouthpiece/gumshield.
- Men must wear a cup protector held around the body via a cup holder under the shorts. The cup may not be worn loosely in underpants. Must not cover navel, beltline or any part of the target area.
Women may use a cup protector and/or a breast protector (may not shield any target area of the body, including breastbone). No metal parts except if there is a fastening at the back.
- Reusable Handwraps and Velcro bandages may be used in any competitions. Bandage not longer than 4.5 m, not shorter than 2.5 m, 5.7 cm wide and made of stretchy cotton material with a Velcro closure.
Only in Elite, the use of Professional Handwraps is allowed. Materials for each hand shall be as follows;
1 roll of 5 cm x 15 m gauze bandage, 1 roll of 5 cm x 10 m gauze to create a knuckle pad, Zinc Oxide Tape 2 rolls of 2.5 cm x 13 m, 1 roll of 1.25 cm x 13 m for between the fingers. The knuckles may not be covered by Tape.
The use of any substance or object on the Gauze, Tape and/or Bandages is prohibited.
If an irregularity is found, boxer will be disqualified (DQ).
- Vests (sleeveless) and shorts (women can also wear a skirt) red or blue according to the respective corner.
The length of the shorts must not be shorter than mid-thigh, cannot cover the knee and must not be worn above the belt line. The belt line must be clearly identified by a contrasting color to the shorts/skirt and vest and must be 6-10 cm wide and must not cover the navel.
No tape allowed on the uniform. No zippers or any other dangerous (hard and/or sharp) parts.
- See also "Attire rules" at the subject "Seconds/coach" on page 4.

Commands by the Referee. "BREAK" both boxers must take a step back and after that, they are allowed to continue boxing. If the referee says "STOP", boxers must step back and must wait until the referee says "BOX".

FOULS and/or infringements of the rules

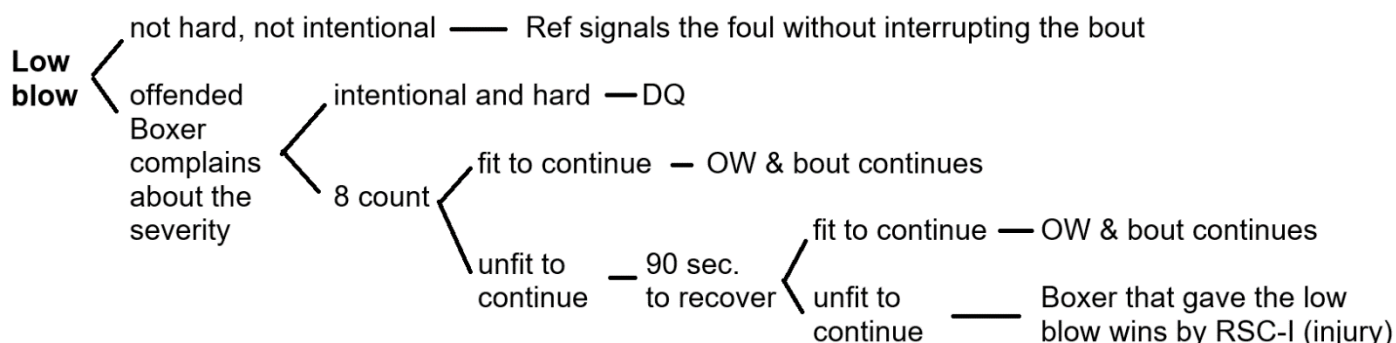
- Hitting; below the belt, the back of the opponent, especially back of the neck or head and a kidney punch
- Hitting with; the head, shoulder, forearm, elbow, wrist, side of the hand, backhand, an open glove, the inside of the glove, slapping, lacing (rubbing the bottom side of an open glove into the opponent's face)
- Tripping, Kicking, Butting, Strangling, Pulling, Lying on, Wrestling, Throwing, Biting, Stepping on opponent's toe, Faking/ simulating, Speaking, Hitting after the bell, and/or Keeping hand straight to obstruct the opponent's vision
- Holding, Holding'n'hitting, Locking opponent's arm or head, or pushing an arm underneath opponent's arm
- Pushing, Pushing opponent's face with an arm or an elbow, Pushing opponent's head back over the ropes
- Attacking whilst holding the ropes or making any unfair use of the ropes
- Attacking an opponent who is down or who is in the act of rising
- Ducking below the belt of the opponent
- Completely passive defense, like; double cover, intentionally falling, running, turning the back to avoid a blow
- Not stepping back when ordered to break
- Attempting to strike opponent immediately after the referee has ordered "break" and before taking a full step back
- Assaulting or behaving in an aggressive manner towards a referee at any time
- Spitting out the gumshield intentionally without receiving a punch = OW (Official Warning)
- If the gumshield falls out after receiving a punch, and if this happens for the 3rd time = OW

OW (Official Warning) = 1 point deduction

3rd OW = DQ (Disqualification)

Head-butt or any other serious illegal blow:

- No injury or cut = OW or DQ
- injury or cut = DQ



Seconds/ coach

- Up to 3 Seconds. However, only 2 may mount the apron of the ring and only 1 may enter the ring during the 1 minute rest between 2 rounds. If at any other time a second enters the ring, the Referee may stop the bout and disqualify the seconds' boxer entering the ring. A second is NOT allowed to enter the ring at the start of the bout and/or after the final round, until the result has been announced.
- Must leave the ring and the apron prior to the start of each round, and must remove seats, towels, buckets, etc.
- Must have a towel for the Boxer during the Bout. A Second may indicate retirement of the Boxer by throwing the towel into the ring, except when the Referee is counting.
- May use Ice bags, Enswell, non-petroleum skin-protective jelly (vaseline) or Cavilon, and transparent bottled water.
- May not administer any drugs aside from the approved ones during the Bout.
- Under no circumstance allowed to administrate supplemental oxygen or any type of inhaler to a Boxer.
- Are not permitted to stand up and/or to encourage or incite spectators by words or signs during the bout.
- Are not allowed to touch the ring during the Bout, yell, cause a scandal or disturb the Competition.
- Are not permitted to walk off Second's designated area with disagreed actions against the Referee.
- Are not permitted to throw any item into the ring to demonstrate a disagreement or to kick any chair or water bottle or to take any other action that may be deemed as unsportsmanlike behavior.
- The use of any communication device is not permitted in the FOP such as but not limited to mobile telephones, walkie-talkies, smart phones, headsets, shortwave radios, etc.
- Seconds are not permitted to yell at/argue with any Official on the FOP during or after the Bout.

Sanctions for seconds; 1st violation on any of the above prohibited activities caution, 2nd violation OW and placed outside of the FOP and 3rd violation removed from the venue for the rest of the event.

Attire

- Uniform, shorts (not shorter than mid-thigh), team jersey, caps, sneakers or track shoes are allowed. No jeans.
- There shall not be any demonstrations, symbols or patterns containing political, religious and racial propaganda, and of items on the WADA prohibited substance list, and messages against the IBA Code of Ethics visible on the Seconds body or apparel including uniform, footwear, socks, permanent or temporary tattoo on the body, etc. Prohibited are offensive gestures or language.

Code of Conduct

Combat Athletes, like boxers, coaches, seconds, etc. should demonstrate high standards of ethics and sportsmanship. The highest potential of sports is achieved when participants are committed to pursuing victory with honor according to core principles: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility & fairness.

- 1.0. I shall ensure that my conduct may not in any manner tarnish the reputation of the sport of boxing.
- 1.1. I shall in all instances, respect all rules and regulations set by CuraBox and the (event) organization.
- 1.2. I shall not collude or collaborate with any party by violating any technical or other rules of the sport.
- 1.3. I shall always conduct myself respectful to the organization, officials, and competitors.
- 1.4. I shall not in any circumstances, directly or indirectly, solicit, accept, or offer any form of remuneration or commission, nor any concealed benefit, service or gift of any nature that could be considered as a bribe or undue influence.
- 1.5. I shall not bet on any part of the boxing competition, bouts, or anything that would conclude a decision of a contest; nor shall I share inside information at any time and in any circumstance.
- 2.0. I must immediately upon receipt, report any approaches or offers, such as those described in 1.4/1.5.
- 3.0. I shall not enter into any form of harassment or abuse, be it physical, professional, or sexual, and cause or instigate any physical or mental injuries outside of the competition.
- 3.1. I shall not discriminate against anyone based on race, color, religion, gender, age, national origin, disability, or sexual orientation.
- 4.0. I shall not engage in disrespectful conduct of any sort including profanity, obscene gestures, and offensive remarks of a sexual or racial nature, trash-talking, taunting, boastful celebrations, or other actions that demean individuals or the sport.
- 4.1. I shall refrain from conduct that could cause serious damage to the sport, including in any case conduct punishable by law and conduct that is seen as socially improper.
- 4.2. I shall live up to high ideals of ethics and sportsmanship and always pursue victory with honor; do what's right even when it's unpopular or personally costly.
- 4.3. I shall respect the (inter)national anti-doping rules, and act accordingly.
- 4.4. I shall honor the spirit and the letter of rules; avoid temptations to gain competitive advantage through improper gamesmanship techniques that violate the highest traditions of sportsmanship.
- 4.5. I declare to be in a proper physical condition to participate in the sport of boxing and in the possession of a valid medical insurance.
- 5.0. I shall not criticize or attempt to explain calls or decisions made by any Boxing Competition Official.
- 5.1. I shall not be under the influence of alcohol or drugs, while participating in any event, including all related meetings, weigh-in duties, etc.
- 5.2. I shall not smoke in the competition venue, or any area not designated as such for smoking.
- 6.0. I acknowledge that any infringement of this code may lead to disciplinary measures/sanctions against me.
- 6.1. I also understand that at any point during an alleged breach of this Code during the competition, that my accreditation may be suspended or removed without prejudice whilst an investigation is initiated or ongoing.
