Summary of the Competition Rules

Amateur boxing competitions in Curaçao can only be organized by CuraBox and/or under the auspices of CuraBox. For safety reasons, these must be conducted under the supervision of qualified competition officials (referees/ judges), ring doctor, first aid, right protective equipment, and according to the class divisions for equivalent matches.

- Boxers born in 2012 or younger can only box exhibition bouts 3 rounds of 1 minute with as result a draw/ 2 winners.

- If both parties, supervisor & CuraBox agree, a boxer can compete in a single bout against a boxer from a class higher. In case of age class difference, according to the rules of the youngest age class of both (duration, headgear, etc.).

- Pre-bout medical examination and the Weigh-In on the same day as the Bout.

Boxer's uniform and equipment

- IBA Approved boxing gloves in the color of the corner. 12 oz. for Men youth & elite +67 kg. All other 10 oz.

- Youth and younger age divisions MUST wear <u>headgear</u>. For hygiene reasons, own approved headgear is permitted. If not wearing a headguard and hair that reaches below the neckline, hair must be secured appropriately.

- Footwear, such as shoes or light boots (without spikes or heels) and socks not higher than the knee.

- Mouthpiece/gumshield.

- Men must wear a <u>cup protector</u> held around the body via a cup holder under the shorts. The cup may not be worn loosely in underpants. Must not cover navel, beltline or any part of the target area.

Women may use a cup protector and/or a breast protector (may not shield any target area of the body, including breastbone). No metal parts except if there is a fastening at the back.

Reusable <u>Handwraps</u> and <u>bandages</u> (not longer than 4.5 m, not shorter than 2.5 m, 5.7 cm wide and made of stretchy cotton material with a Velcro closure) may be used in any competitions. Only in Elite, Professional Handwraps allowed. For each hand; 1 roll of 5 cm x 15 m gauze bandage, 1 roll of 5 cm x 10 m gauze to create a knuckle pad, Zinc Oxide Tape 2 rolls of 2.5 cm x 13 m, 1 roll of 1.25 cm x 13 m for between the fingers. The knuckles may not be covered by Tape. The use of any substance or object on the Gauze, Tape and/or Bandages is prohibited. If an irregularity is found, boxer will be disqualified (DQ).

- <u>Vests</u> (sleeveless) and <u>shorts</u> (women can also wear a skirt) red or blue according to the corner. The length of the shorts must not be shorter than mid-thigh, cannot cover the knee and must not be worn above the belt line. The belt line must be clearly identified by a contrasting color to the shorts/skirt and vest and must be 6-10 cm wide and must not cover the navel. No tape allowed on the uniform. No zippers or any other dangerous (hard and/or sharp) parts.

- Women may wear a black sport form-fitting <u>Hijab</u>, long-sleeved and full-length, under the vest and shorts or skirt. - There shall not be any demonstrations, symbols or patterns containing political, religious and racial propaganda, and of items on the WADA prohibited substance list, visible on body, gear, wear or any other item.

- Only soft contact lenses allowed. All other contact lenses are prohibited. If the boxer loses contact lenses, the boxer accepts to continue to box and the bout continues or the boxer does not accept to continue to box without contact lenses, the referee terminates the bout, and the opponent is declared the winner by ABD (abandon).

- A boxer wearing braces on both upper and lower sets of teeth, can box if he/she is wearing a fitted gumshield.
- Allowed to use Kinesiology taping; but it can only be applied from waist down, and to the back of the body.

- No body piercing and no body accessories are permitted to be worn during a bout.

Commands by the Referee. "BREAK" both boxers must take a step back and after that, they are allowed to continue boxing. If the referee says "STOP", boxers must step back and must wait until the referee says "BOX".

FOULS and/or infringements of the rules

Hitting; below the belt, the back of the opponent, especially back of the neck or head and kidney punch
Hitting with; the head, shoulder, forearm, elbow, wrist, side of the hand, backhand, open glove, inside of the glove, slapping, lacing (rubbing the bottom side of an open glove into the opponent's face)

Tripping, Kicking, Butting, Strangling, Pulling, Lying on, Wrestling, Throwing, Biting, Spitting, Hair pulling/grabbing, Stepping on opponent's toe, Hitting after the bell, Keeping hand straight to obstruct the opponent's vision, holding the ropes, making any unfair use of the ropes, attacking an opponent who is down or who is in the act of rising.
 Holding, Holding'n'hitting, Locking opponent's arm or head, or pushing an arm underneath opponent's arm

- Pushing, Pushing opponent's face with an arm or an elbow, Pushing opponent's head back over the ropes

Disregard of the referee's instructions; continuing to box after the command "BREAK" or "STOP", not stepping back when ordered to BREAK, attempting to strike opponent immediately after the referee has ordered "BREAK" and before taking a full step back, and/or attacking an opponent before "BOX", after a "STOP" command.
 Speaking, assaulting and/or behaving in an aggressive manner towards a referee/official, unsportsmanlike and/or

undisciplined conduct of any kind.

Any action or activity by the seconds aimed at disrupting the bout or causing an unfair advantage to be given to a corner's boxer. Seconds are not allowed to distract the referee or influence the actions of the referee in any fashion.
Ducking below the belt of the opponent, passive double cover defense, intentionally falling, running, turning the back, simulating being hit too low, falsely claiming a foul, faking an injury, dropping or spitting out the mouth guard.

- Spitting out the mouth guard/ gumshield intentionally without receiving a punch = OW (Official Warning)

- If the mouth guard/ gumshield falls out after receiving a punch, and if this happens for the 3rd time = OW

<u>OW (Official Warning)</u> = 1 point deduction 3rd OW = DQ (Disqualification) Head-butt or any other serious illegal blow: - No injury or cut = OW or DQ - injury or cut = DQ not hard, not intentional — Ref signals the foul without interrupting the bout I ow offended intentional and hard -DQ blow Boxer complains fit to continue - OW & bout continues about the 8 count severity fit to continue — OW & bout continues 90 sec. unfit to continue to recover unfit to Boxer that gave the low continue blow wins by RSC-I (injury)

Seconds/ coach

- Up to 3 Seconds. Only 2 may mount the apron and only 1 may enter the ring during the 1 minute rest between 2 rounds. If at any other time a second enters the ring, the Referee may stop the bout and disqualify the seconds' boxer entering the ring. NOT allowed to enter at the start or after final round, until the result has been announced.

Must leave the ring and the apron prior to the start of each round, and must remove seats, towels, buckets, etc.
 Must have a towel for the Boxer during the Bout. A Second may indicate retirement of the Boxer by throwing the towel into the ring, except when the Referee is counting.

- May use Ice bags, Enswell, non-petroleum skin-protective jelly (vaseline) or Cavilon, and transparent bottled water.
- May not administer any drugs aside from the approved ones during the Bout.
- Under no circumstance allowed to administrate supplemental oxygen or any type of inhaler to a Boxer.
- Not permitted to stand up and/or to encourage or incite spectators by words or signs during the bout.
- Not allowed to touch the ring during the Bout, yell, cause a scandal or disturb the Competition.
- Not permitted to walk off Second's designated area with disagreed actions against the Referee.

- Not permitted to yell at/argue with any Official or demonstrate disagreement by throwing any item, kicking any chair or water bottle or to take any other action that may be deemed as unsportsmanlike behavior.

- The use of any communication device is not permitted in the FOP (field of play).

- Sportswear, but No demonstrations, symbols or patterns containing political, religious and racial propaganda, and of items on the WADA prohibited substance list, visible including permanent or temporary tattoo on the body, etc. <u>Sanctions for seconds</u>; 1st violation on any of the above prohibited activities caution, 2nd violation OW and placed outside of the FOP and 3rd violation removed from the venue for the rest of the event.
